The Māori Education Trust administers scholarships in its own right and with other agencies. The scholarships are available to Māori undergraduate students who meet **all** of the following criteria:

## THE STUDENT MUST:

- be of New Zealand Māori descent;
- be enrolled at a NZVCC recognised university, or a NZQA recognised tertiary institute in 2007 (unless otherwise stated);
- send with the application a verified deposit slip, cancelled cheque or bank statement with a printed bank account number;
- be studying full-time for the full-year; and
- send the fully completed application form in on time.

Note: Each scholarship also has its own specific criteria.

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- There are nineteen undergraduate scholarships available.
- You must complete all of Part A of the application form and only the scholarships you want to apply for in Part B.
- The 2007 application form will only be accepted for 2007 entries.
- You can apply for as many scholarships as you like, however if successful you will only be awarded one.
- All applications must be sent to the Māori Education Trust on or before the closing date. This will be checked by the date stamped by the postal company (Note: Contact your local post shop for the time your mail box is cleared to ensure it will be date stamped for the correct date).
- **No missing or corrected information will be accepted after the closing date.** The earlier you submit your application the more chance you have of being able to resubmit information if your application is incomplete or ineligible (Note: **The Trust cannot guarantee that you will have the chance to resubmit**).
- Do not fax or e-mail this application form or any other supporting documentation to the Māori Education Trust. Only original copies of the application form will be accepted (invoices, certificates etc, can be photocopies).
- Changes to your eligibility via fax, e-mail or telephone will not be accepted.

**History**

John Tapiata, of Te Arawa and Ngāti Porou descent, was born in 1935. He was a teacher, lecturer and advisor. He believed the best way to develop Māori sport, fitness and leisure was by offering opportunities to Māori to achieve the highest qualifications in the area of sport and leisure. This is a recurring scholarship.

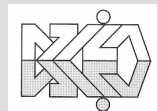

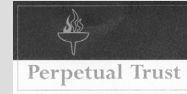
